History of the SDPL

In June 1987 Hannah North and Russ Weber (aka Amentia Allegro and Rass Webo) compiled a list of peaks in San Diego County. They did this by combining an extensive knowledge of the county and sitting down at a map of the Cleveland National Forest. They both climbed ½ of the peaks before moving away a year later. I have now climbed every peak and benchmark on the list (except for 10) and eliminated insignificant climbs and areas of trespassing. I have deleted 35 peaks and added about 20 peaks. Preparing this list has been very enjoyable and I get all a tingle just thinking about the possibility of climbing these peaks again. My favorite peaks are called 'emblem peaks' and are marked by an asterisk (*). There are 14 emblem peaks.
