

Jan 16 Palm Desert orienteer. Bill Gookin 578-9456. This orienteer is Sat pretty far out there, but it is my favorite.

Jan 24 Lost Ruin (aka Recluse Springs).Paul 692-1367. (See Schad, p.278, Sun Myer Valley/Boulder Creek). This hike starts in the same place that Jerry does but then goes a different direction. You will see old ruins by a beautiful spring (unmarked on topo maps) and see a hidden rockhouse (separate location). Hey, Beth, come on out. This hike is for you! Jerry sez 3 stars difficulty and I'll agree. Lots of boulder hopping.

Jan 30-31 Coyote Canyon Clunker Classic. Two things I've always said about this is (1) it is the most fun you can have on a mountain bike, and (2) the t-shirts are the best of any event. Well, Bicycling! magazine awarded them 1st place in a nationwide contest of cycling events. The Clunker Classic is a mountain bike ride from Anza to Borrego, a distance of 32 miles. During the ride you experience steep downhill with about 4 trouble spots (with SKILL you can ride it, the meek dismount and walk), then you hit sand on the desert floor, interspersed with creekbed (where, again, the skilled ride and the meek get their feet wet). Over 300 riders enjoyed the event last year. The event meets at Christmas Circle in Borrego, buses take passengers to Anza (U-Hauls take bikes), a BBQ (all you can stand) is ready for you at the finish, as well as your award winning T-shirt. Last year's cost was \$40.

Jan 30 HPS banquet in LA. Guest speakers are locals, Randy Danta and Doug Mantle, who, in the spring, climbed Everest. Doug is busy planning to climb Vinson Massif in Antartica, then complete his quest of the "seven summits" in Australia. Call Paul 692-1367.

Sawtooth Mtn. This is the mountain due west of Red Top, for those of you who were on last year's grunt.
